Parallel session 6A: Transition to Real-Time Tax Compliance: Implementation and Business Engagement

Technological advancements and real-time data reporting are transforming how businesses interact with tax authorities. In this session, presentations from tax administrations and business representatives will address how changes in the taxation system affect business operations and explore the new compliance tools that offer advanced functionalities like secure transaction recording and real-time tax computation boosting efficiency and reducing costs.

Parallel session 6B: Advanced Data Analytics: Driving the Change

This parallel session will consist of presentations from three countries covering their approaches to utilizing real-time data analytics. These presentations will focus on how tax authorities are managing the process (particularly on transactional data), improving both enforcement and service delivery.

Parallel session 6C: Real-Time Economy and Timely Revenue Collection: cases of operational implementation

Faster inflows of immediate or near-instant tax reporting and payment will have beneficial effects on tax collection, reducing revenue leakage from fraud and late declarations. This parallel session will contain presentations from three countries covering the changes in operations needed to support an effective, timely revenue collection.

- Real-Time Monitoring of Taxpayer Behaviour: It will enable authorities to track tax obligations continuously, adjusting risk models and audits based on live data.
