The Intra-European Organisation of Tax Administrations (IOTA) is organising the digital workshop “*Artificial Intelligence in Risk Analysis: Balancing Automation and Human Judgment*”, to be broadcasted live via Microsoft Teams, on 8-9 April 2026.

Artificial intelligence (AI) is becoming a significant component of the digital government journey, offering substantial benefits in various areas such as automation, anomaly detection and improved decision-making. The rise of AI and its use in tax compliance is an emerging trend that significantly enhances efficiency and accuracy in tax-related processes.

The workshop will benefit of presentations delivered by representatives of key stakeholders – international organisations, tax administrations, researchers and private companies **targeting:**

The group discussion session will provide participants with the opportunity to:

- Exchange **practical experiences** on AI in tax risk analysis
- Explore key pinpoints and lessons learned for **balancing AI-driven automation and human decision-making**
- Identify **good practices in governance, transparency, and oversight.**
